has been.





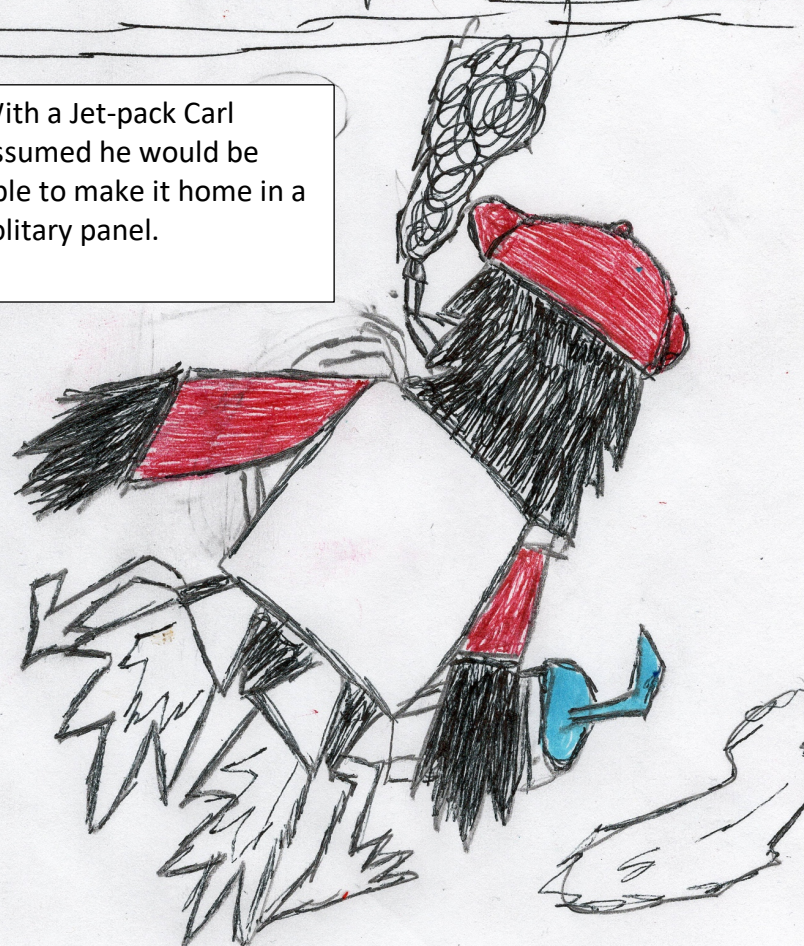
Carl before heading home, makes a quick stop at his local square W.

With a Jet-pack Carl assumed he would be able to make it home in a solitary panel.







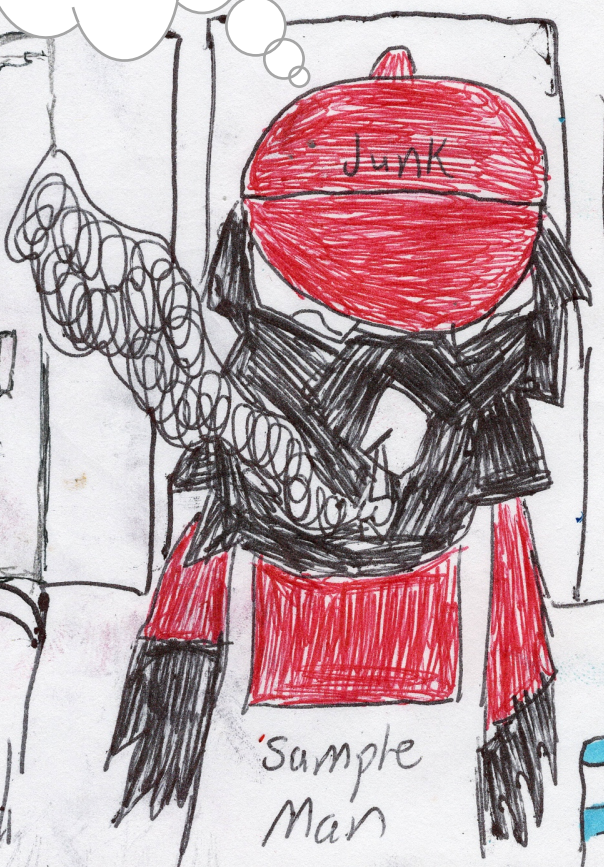
Now that Carl has finally made it back to his apartment could it finally be time for the Callow Corvus to relax?

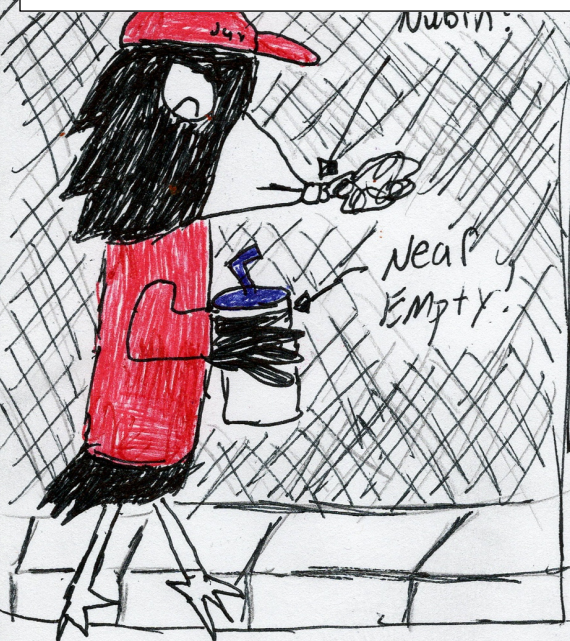

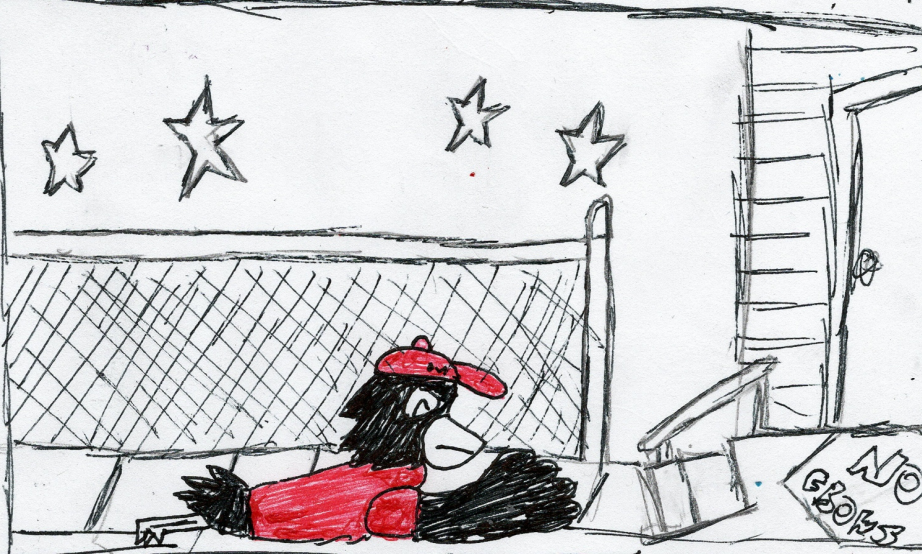
Things seems to be looking grim for our hero.

What's this? Carl's Fairy Demon Father!



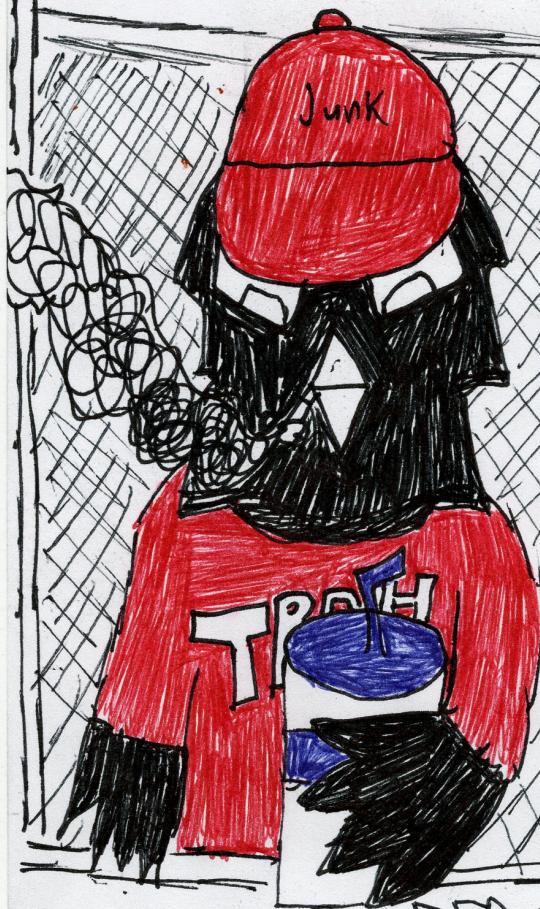
More Lung Candy!
